Whether you are a resident, business owner or visiting our city, we have a vast number of opportunities for you to explore.



Our location at the southern tip of Lake Michigan provides quick access to Chicago as well as the nation's interstate system. Convenient access to the Indiana Toll Road, as well as Interstate 80/94. allows residents and visitors a myriad of opportunities for jobs, shopping, recreational activities, and dining experiences.

We are also home to the Port of Indiana and the Indiana Dunes National Park.

Our access to Lake Michigan is highlighted through the West Beach and Portage Lakefront and Riverwalk units of the Indiana Dunes National Park, providing miles of trails for those wanting to hike the dunes and beautiful beaches to enjoy on a warm summer day.

The city itself has 15 parks, encompassing 650 acres of recreational opportunities, from playgrounds to picnic areas, a dog park and community buildings. The Prairie Duneland Trail and Iron Horse Heritage Trail provide miles of walking and biking opportunities. The Marquette Greenway Trail, which traverses the northern portion of the city, will eventually link Chicago to New Buffalo, Michigan.







BUILDING DEPARTMENT

219-762-4204

The function of the Building Department is to promote public safety by enforcing building standards. Building Department services include:

Building Permits:

Permits are needed to authorize construction & inspections.

Contractor Licensing:

Contractors and subcontractors must be licensed, bonded and insured to work in the City of Portage.

Inspections:

Inspect construction for conformance with the plan, the permit and with state & local building codes.

Plan Review:

Review construction plans to ensure they meet compliance with our state & our local requirements.

Engineering:

Oversees engineering services for the Plan Commission, Redevelopment Commission, Board of Public Works and Safety and Traffic Commission.

Designs, manages & inspects city construction projects.

Inspects private developer construction projects.

Reviews site plans and subdivision plats for adequacy, accuracy and compliance.

Assists in grant development and administration

Manages consultants, contractors & subcontractors.

Issues Right-of-Way permits.

Geographic Information System:

Manages & provides GIS information for the City of Portage.

Maintains & manages the City and utility GIS data base.

Manages the web services pertaining to Portage City maps.

Provides resources to City Depts. related to assets, planning and mapping.

FIRE DEPARTMENT 219-762-7404

Randy Wilkening, Fire Chief

The Portage Fire Department consists of 62 full time, career EMT/Firefighters, of which 53 are also Paramedics.

We respond to 6100 emergency calls annually from three staffed fire stations.
